# Annual Report <u>15<sup>th</sup> Oct 2019</u>

- *"Storm to Perform"* is the inspiring theme given by our dear Swami Swaroopanandaji and this mantra has been the force behind all our activities in CIRS.
- With the support of all of you and with the blessings of our Pujya Gurudev, CIRS in the 24<sup>th</sup> year of its inception is progressing well with 580 students 345 boys and 235 girls from 22 states in India and 18 different countries across the world. We have a team of 67 faculty members and 68 admin team members working tirelessly and extending support for teaching and administration.
- This year again the in the 2019 Survey conducted by the Delhi based C-fore organization; Education World has ranked all schools across the country. We are happy to share with you that CIRS has moved from the 4<sup>th</sup> place to 2<sup>nd</sup> place in the country among the India's Top Co-Ed boarding schools and for the 8<sup>th</sup> consecutive year continues to retain the no 1 position in Tamil Nadu. My hearty congratulations to dear parents.

• We are happy to share with the Parents CBSE has selected CIRS as one of the Lead Schools, and we will be guiding 5 other CBSE schools.

• CBSE is also making a hand book for Teachers on Peace Curriculum and I have received the honour of being a part of the five member committee.

• We would like to share with the Parents from this year Sanskrit has been made a compulsory subject and it has been introduced in class5 this year and slowly it will be taken forward.

• The academic performance of our students in the board examinations has been getting better and better over the years and it gives me immense joy to share salient features of the Board exam results of our class10 & 12 students:

• The average score of the class 12 science stream is 92.06 % and the management stream is 94.23%. Out of 45 students who appeared in the class 12 examination all 45 of them have secured above 80% in the aggregate. And 41 of them have secured above 90% as their aggregate marks. That was indeed a tremendous performance by our students.

• Kum. Sunaina Jhajaria has topped the CBSE management stream securing 97%. & Kum Ridu Varshini has topped the CBSE science stream with an aggregate of 96.4%. We would like to congratulate the parents of Kum. L R Ridu Varshini who has secured 100 in Entrepreneurship Development & Kum. Ashwini Athreya who has secured 100% in Informatics Practices. Would like to take this opportunity to thank all the teachers and specially congratulate Ms. Annapoorni & Ms. Saranya for getting centum in their respective subjects.

- The Coimbatore Sahodaya complex has given a certificate of academic excellence to CIRS for having maximum number students securing above 90% as aggregate in the class12 Board examination. The students who secured 90% and above as aggregate were also given certificates.
- Our IB students have also brought in remarkable results with 100 % of them getting the diploma. Kum. Anagha Nair has topped the batch with a stunning score of 45 out of a possible 45 points with an Indian equivalent of 96.4%. She has created an academic record in the IB diploma program and I am happy to share with you she is one of the 123 world toppers. As per the Indian equivalent of marks sent by the IB board, the average of the batch is 87.46%. All of them have secured admissions in premier universities in India and abroad. The details of the same has been displayed in the IB block and also available in the website.
  - The performance of our students of class 10 at the CBSE 2019 Final examinations has been highly commendable. Out of 91

students 83 of them have passed with an aggregate of 80% and above. We would like to congratulate the parents of all our class 10 students. I am also happy to share with our parents that average of the batch is an impressive 88.96%. We would like to congratulate the parents of Master. Nihar Mukund who has topped the batch with 97.4%.

- I am sure our parents are familiar with the merit card system, which has been introduced to motivate students to enhance their own performance in Academics. I am happy to share with you in the recent 1st term examination, 296 students 51% of the strength received the merit certificates in various subjects. This indeed is a remarkable achievement by our children and has boosted the academic standards of the school.

• The AP Program is a global academic program offered in secondary schools. Universities around the world recognize AP Exam scores for admission, credit and placement. We are happy to share that Vishweswar from IB II year has won the AP scholar award by scoring 5 out of a possible 5 in all the three subjects. He has been awarded a Scholar award by the AP College Board. He comes under the top 3% among one million students who appeared for the exam. We are indeed proud of him.

#### •Subject week celebrations:

To enhance thinking skills we celebrate Subject weeks every year. During the week Children work on projects, participate in competitions and are also exposed to variety of activities right from the morning assembly.

• The Mathematics department, as part of the Mathematics week 2019 organized an exciting maths run in which almost 160 children participated. The junior school students also enjoyed participating in a maths quiz.

• Extensive seva activities during the Seva week. Children took the theme as Zero food wastage and prepared posters and also created awareness. Children also took the task of cleaning Chinmaya Gardens and the school Campus.

- JAM, debates, spell bee, quiz, recitations and short story telling sessions were organized during the English week by the English department.
- The social science department organized a week packed with activities. Decoding spy letter, Renaming monuments, presentation on Geographical identity tag, Predicting futuristic headlines & Acrostic poem were few of the innovative activities conducted by the sst dept.
