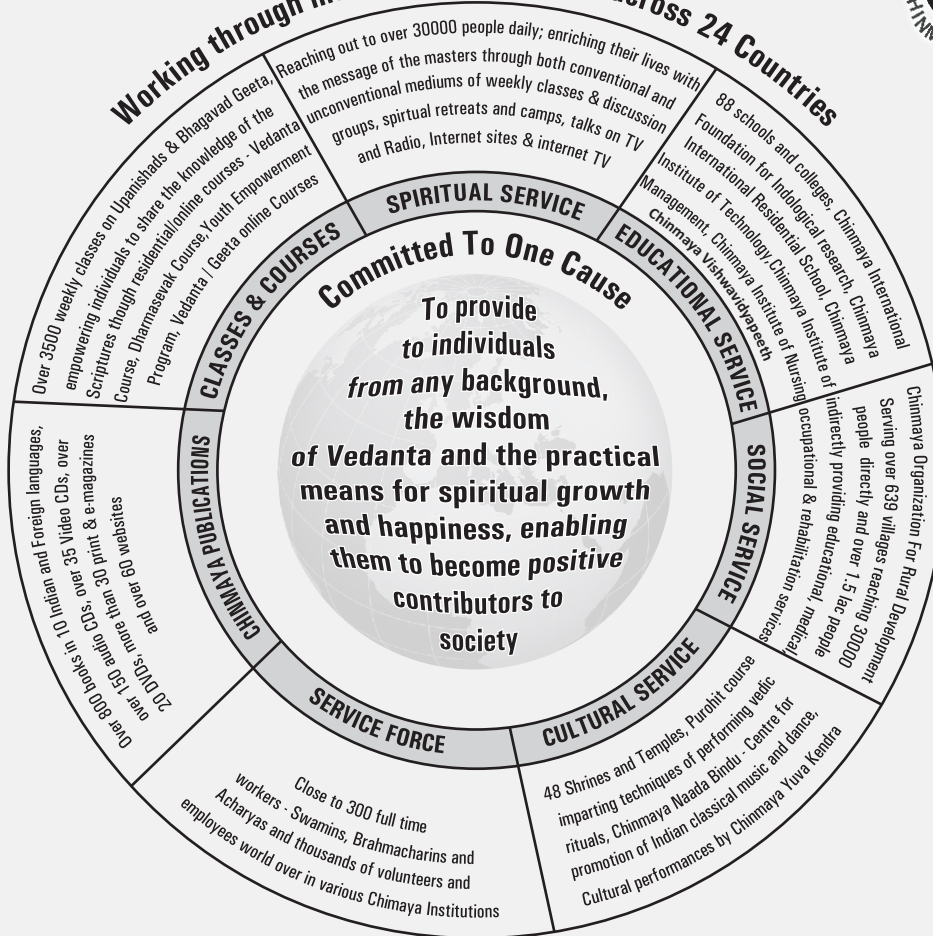

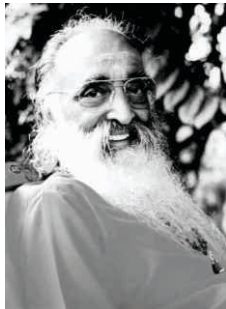
Our Founder

“Rethink Realign Reboot”

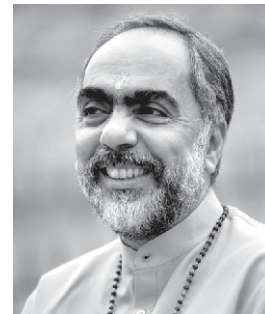
Being the most advanced species on earth, we have all the freedom to live our precious life to the fullest and to achieve the greatness we aspire for.

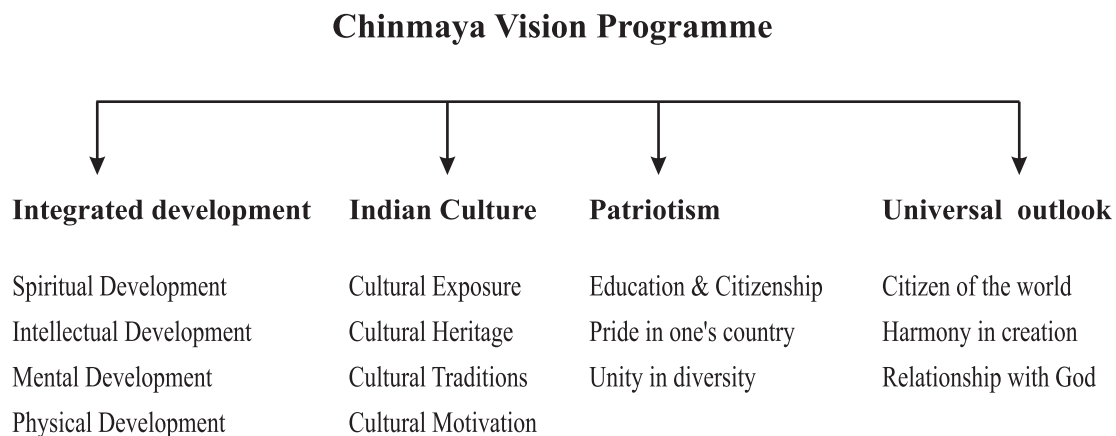

Language Policy

1. The second and third languages of a student shall be decided in consultation with the parents and the student by the language panel at the time of interview. For classes V to VIII, the student should take Sanskrit either as second or third language.
2. Once the languages have been decided, they cease to be optional and the students are expected to continue learning the same in the forthcoming years.
3. However, if a student wants to change his/her second or third language for any genuine reason, he/she will be allowed to do so only in classes V and VI.
4. Change of language is not automatic on request. It is subject to the availability and the aptitude of the students. The language teachers concerned will advise, guide and decide based on the observation and scrutiny of the student's language skills, while keeping in mind the benefit and the academic progress of the student concerned.
5. Finally, change of language is permitted in consultation with the HOD and on recommendations from the concerned language teachers.



School Uniform / Turn Out Code

Uniformity is the cornerstone of living in a residential school. The following is designed to inculcate and maintain this uniformity. The students may bring to School only the items mentioned in this kit. Students will not be allowed to keep any item not conforming to the given list.

- The school uniforms worn by students should be of the right fit, neat and properly pressed.
- Shoes (as per the recommended uniform by CIRS) should be properly polished and maintained neatly everyday.
- Boys are not permitted to wear uniform shirts without pockets.
- Students are permitted to wear their color/ white house T-shirts and dark blue shorts as per the schedule.
- Students should wear sports shoes or the specific shoes for the respective games during the games time. Wearing sandals during these activities is not permitted; casual slippers are permitted only in the dorm.
- For any outing, students should wear jeans and outing Grey T-shirts.
- Boys are strictly prohibited from sagging their pants. Wearing thin or small shorts like boxer shorts is considered inappropriate.
- Hair should be neatly combed. Use of gel or hair setters for having raised hair styles are prohibited.
- Growing long hair, beard or side burns is not permitted for the boys.
- Girls should use black hair slides, clips and hair bands to tie their hair neatly and will not be allowed to bring any dress that is sleeveless, transparent or with low neck.
- Students are not permitted to wear necklaces, bracelets or rings except on Sundays or with festival dress. (No Silver, Gold and Diamond)
- Personal dresses should strictly adhere to the decorum and decency expected by the school.
- Torn jeans / shred jeans or similar wear are not permitted.
- Students are expected to write the Name and Roll No. on all their items with permanent markers.
- Students should not have tinted hair when they come to school after holidays.
- Transgression of rules will result in items being returned to the parent. If the offence is repeated, the item will be donated to charity.
- Students are expected to wear Indian traditional dress during Indian festivals in accordance with the school schedule.

Tucks / Eatables

The school provides wholesome variety food; standardized for all the students and staff on campus. Therefore;

- a. Students are **not** allowed to keep eatables in the school premises.
- b. Visiting parents / guardians are **not** allowed to bring any eatables with them and/or invite their wards to eat with them in the cars.
- c. Any special food on health grounds such as threptin / protein biscuits, dry fruits etc. shall be provided by the School after ratification from the Medical Centre of the School.

Consequences for default :-

- a. The first instance, all materials shall be distributed to charity and parents will be informed.
- b. At the second instance, the material shall be distributed to charity and the student shall not get his / her Sunday tuck in School for the whole term.
- c. At the third instance, the student shall be suspended from the School.

Toiletries

- a. The student should bring all toiletry items required for the whole term at the time of reporting to school in the beginning of the term.
- b. The student is **NOT** allowed to use cosmetics, nail polish, eye-liner, lipstick, sparkles, eye shadows, blusher, hair dyes, hair gel, colour kajal and coloured lenses are strictly not allowed.
- c. The student will not be allowed to receive any toiletry item from home during the term ; If required, the student shall be supplied toiletry items by the school during the term. The choice shall be limited to those specified by the School from time to time.

Cash / Valuables

We have children from the best strata of society. To safeguard their possessions, the school has formulated the following rules. Strict adherence of these rules is required. Accordingly-

- a. The School cannot arrange for the safe – keeping of any valuables, and therefore, it is desired that students do not bring any valuables with him/her.
- b. Cash left over from the journey from home to school shall be handed over by the student to the resident house parent immediately on entry into the dorm; the cash shall be credited to the student's personal account.
- c. Any cash found with the student thereafter shall be confiscated and donated.
- d. Students may keep only the following items at their own responsibilities:
 - i. One still camera.
 - ii. One MP3 player or I-pod – ONLY audio. No screens allowed.
 - iii. One wrist watch. Smart watches are not permitted.
 - iv. One pair of ear-rings; studs (not droplets) for girls.
 - v. One hair dryer.
 - vi. One necklace, one pair of bracelets, one ring for girls.
 - vii. Basic model mobile phone. (with no internet facility)

* Items i, ii & vii has to be deposited with the Warden/RHP .

Any other item found with the student shall be taken and sent back to the parents.

Miscellaneous

1. Medicines: Only children who need special health attention with permission from the Medical Centre can bring medicines for the whole term. Parcels are strictly prohibited without permission during the term.
2. Books: In order to avoid confusion, it is essential that if a student requires any external reference book, the respective subject teacher has to ensure that the book is handed over to the student through them, and not through any other means. Parents are requested to cross check with the concerned subject teacher, if necessary.
3. After the holidays no parcels will be entertained. All keys must be handed over to RHP/RHM before going home to avoid forgetfulness in bringing them while coming back to school.
4. Children are permitted to read books appropriate to their age. School bans and confiscates books that are inappropriate to their age.

Registration

The date of the admission test is intimated to the registered candidates well in advance. Leave, Visiting and Outing

Ours is a fully residential school and our calendar includes a number of child centered activities. Every time a child leaves the school, he/she is missing out on an opportunity to learn and have fun. Children whose parents/guardians cannot visit them feel left out when they see their friends go for an outing often. The frequent and unscheduled outings also make it difficult for us to plan suitable activities.

The following rules are designed to help you to help us :

- a. The school shall allow leave only for the marriage of a sibling of the student, only for a maximum of 3 days.
- b. Students are allowed to go out with parents/guardians only twice a year after the Parents' Meet and Sports' Meet; permission shall not be granted for any other occasion.
- c. Students shall be allowed for visit /outing only with persons as specified in the list in the following page.
- d. Students are allowed to go for the Sunday outing after breakfast at 9:00am and must return to the campus before 7:30pm.
- e. Guardians other than parents must carry an authorization in writing in the prescribed form on page 44, from the parents to meet and/or take the child out. The authorized person is totally responsible for student's behaviour outside the CIRS campus on these days.

f. First default for late return shall result in an automatic disallowance of the next outing; second default shall mean no outing for the remaining term.

g. Students should not bring any eatables or unwanted items while returning after an outing.

h. The school reserves the right to deny permission to any student going with a guardian / another parent if the school finds that the child is not sufficiently taken care of by the guardian / another parent.

Policies regarding parcels from Parents / Guardian

- a. Parents are requested to seek permission from the school authority before sending any parcel/package either by post/courier or through any visitor.

Policies regarding late reporting after vacation

Late reporting to the School after the vacations makes the student miss the requisite introductory and revision time and the child set back from day one. Additionally, it creates problems for the teachers as the child has to be tutored separately in an effort towards making up for the academic loss.

Breach of Discipline

1. Anybody found violating this rule will be expelled without notice.
2. School does not allow any inappropriate and unhealthy relationship/behaviour between same/opposite genders in school or outside. Any violation of such rules will lead to strict disciplinary action/expulsion.
3. A student found guilty of using unfair means / malpractice / cheating of any kind in any assignment / examination / test will be dealt with very firmly and shall face severe consequences.
4. A student found guilty of any serious breach of discipline will be summarily expelled from the school without any liability on the part of the institution. The school will in no way be liable to return any part of the fee paid by the student.

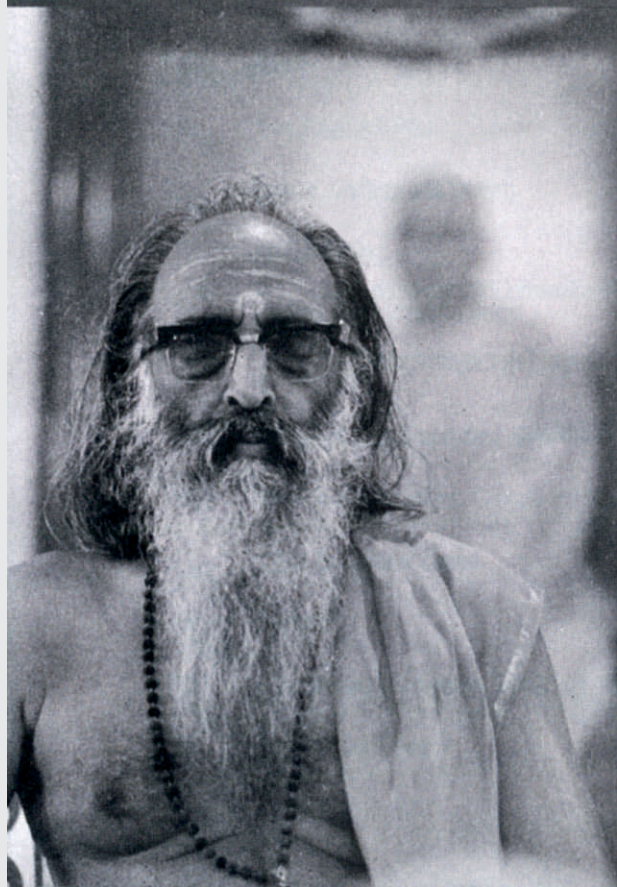
